NCLB is a:

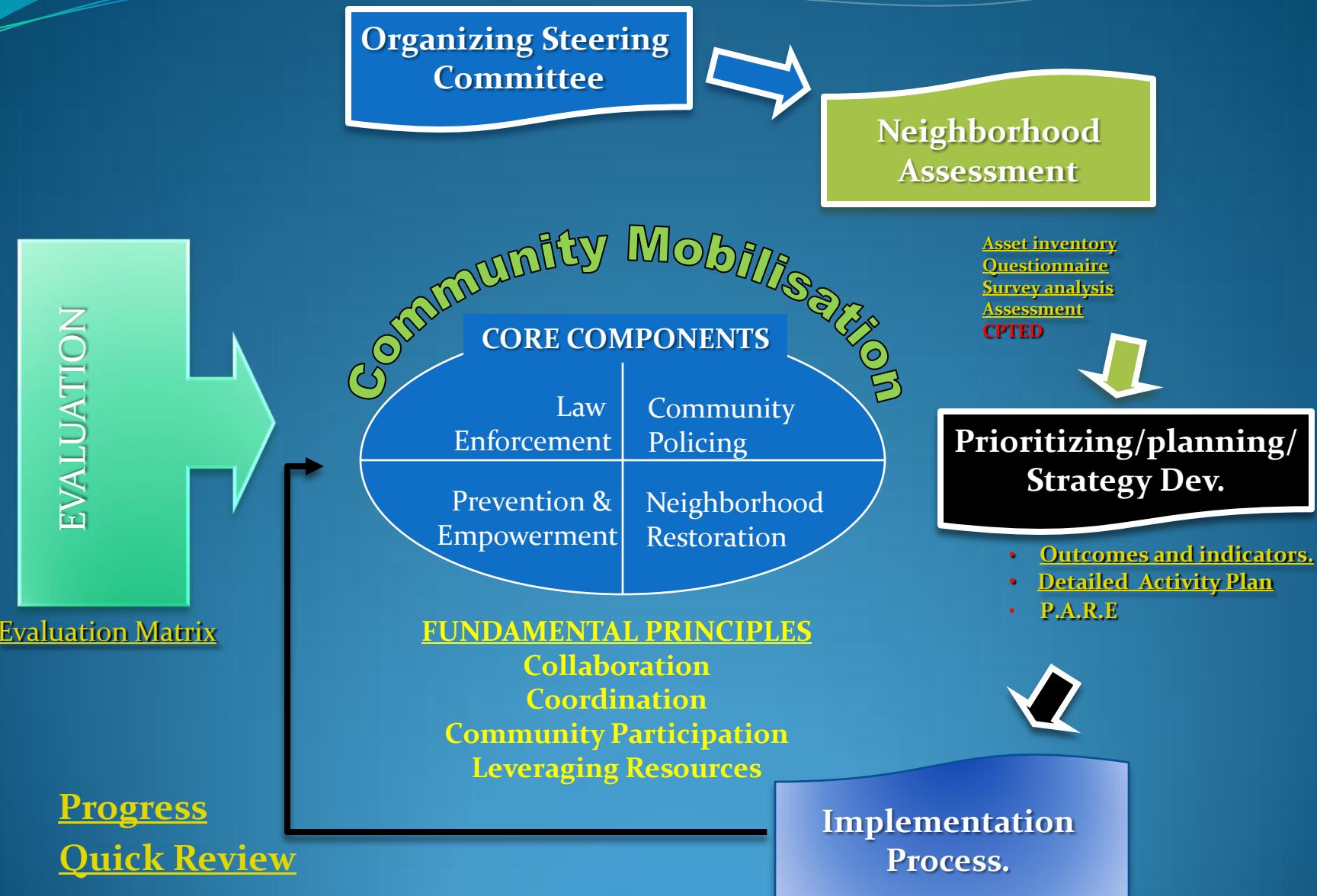
STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

NCLB Components and Process



Strategy Development process

Flexible to help different communities **identify** their **specific needs** and problems and look for **solutions** according to the available **assets and opportunities**.

Neighbourhood Profiles (NP)

- The Univ. of Ottawa NP will become one component of the NCLB process
- NP will help communities interested in replicating NCLB to build on these profiles and move to the planning phase.

NCLB

Ensures the involvement of residents, service providers and volunteers in all phases of the community development process.



NCLB

Leads to the establishment of **community forums** which meet regularly and help in:

- Making community outreach fruitful,
- Building bridges,
- Establishing trust,
- Giving input,
- Getting information,
- Collaboration with service providers,
- Generating knowledge and skills, and
- increasing community capacity



NCLB

**Provides service providers
and funders with opportunity to:**

- Make issue-specific interventions**
- Collaborate & increase the return on investment by reducing duplication and engaging in partnerships.**
- Re-evaluate funding priorities.**
- Minimize “silos” amongst services.**
